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Reception

This week we have started to look at The Runaway Chapatti with a focus on India. The children have been able to compare India to our country and see how they might be similar or different. During our reading we have also put a focus on predictions and the children have loved thinking about what might happen next. Alongside this we had an amazing World Book Day! There were some fabulous costumes. The children enjoyed learning our WBD poem: 'Crick, Crack, Crocodile' and creating leaf drawings with their favourite book cover on for a whole school display.

In phonics we have learnt two new sounds: ar and or, and tricky word 'are'. We have continued to practice our writing of CVC words and captions in our phonics writing books including our new sounds.

In maths we have been learning about 1 more and 1 less as well as using our subitising skills to recognise '5 and a bit' when counting higher than 5. E.G. 5 and 1 more is 7 / 5 and 3 more is 8.





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Year 1

What a busy week we have had in year 1! In maths we have been reviewing how to count sets of objects to 50 using tens and ones and have completed problem solving and reasoning activities related to this area.

In English we have been looking at the book, "Where the Wild things Are" by Maurice Sendak. The children have enjoyed exploring the book and have used the book as inspiration for writing their own story settings. In science the children have learnt to identify the signs of Spring and have enjoyed taking part in a Spring walk.

We really enjoyed World Book Day on Thursday and it was lovely to hear about the children's favourite books. The children worked hard to learn and perform some wonderful animal poems by Joseph Coelho and Daniel Gray- Barnett.





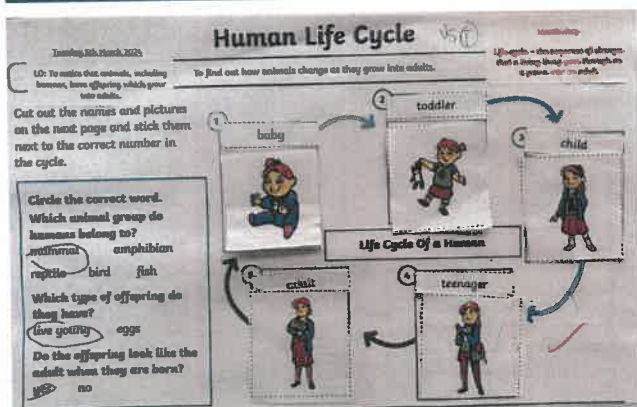
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Year 2

This week, Year 2 have demonstrated great resilience and perseverance during our assessments. They have all tried really hard to showcase their learning so far this year. The children have also been completing a carousel of activities which will continue into next week. Some of the children have started sewing their puppets during design and technology lessons while others have been learning about the life cycles of humans and animals in science. In art, we have started creating a little treat for Mother's Day which the children are so excited to take home.





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Year 3

It has been another exciting week in Year 3.

In science, the children have continued their learning about plants. This week, the children looked at how different species of plants have adapted to their habitats. In order to bring this learning to life, the children observed a variety of different plants. As they did this, they discussed how these plants may have adapted to their natural environments.

In D.T., the children have been looking at different types of food. As part of this, the children looked at where food comes from and how it is made.

On Thursday, it was World Book Day. The children loved learning about poetry; listening to poems and performing their own poetry. Well done, Year 3!





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Year 4

Year 4 all looked fantastic in their World Book Day outfits this week and enjoyed exploring poetry from the book *Poems Aloud* by the Author Joseph Coelho. The children enjoyed learning and performing *Turn the Radio Up*. They were very creative with their use of gestures, body percussion and their voices. We were exploring the poetic techniques of onomatopoeia and crescendo. We have also been learning about poetry in our English lessons and enjoyed creating our own Kennings for a 'special person' in our lives.





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Year 5

What a great week! 5M began the week with a visit to Werrington library. We had a great time on World Book Day performing our version of Michael Rosen's Chocolate Cake. We have very expressive performers in Year 5 who really engaged the listeners with their expressions and gestures. Of course, we couldn't perform a poem about chocolate cake without at least having some to eat - delicious! We had amazing costumes too - a year full of wonderful characters! Thank you for your support in this activity! Our Henry Moore inspired sculptures got a very effective metallic finish to them this week. They look fantastic! We had some practical science investigations being carried out this week too. It was lovely to see you at open classrooms this week, if you were able to pop in, and share the work we have been doing.

Next week we are looking forward to going back in time to the Victorian era when we have a visit from a Victorian Doctor. They will be telling us about medical welfare from those times. We will let you know it went next week!





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Year 6

In maths, we have had real success constructing 2D shapes using a ruler, protractor and specific measurements. The accuracy of the shapes made by the children was fabulous! We have also been revising our 2D and 3D shape knowledge and reminding ourselves of the mathematical vocabulary linked to the topic.

This week, Year 6 have also enjoyed planning the designs for their electrical games that they will be making in Design and Technology. They have had to consider how an electrical circuit could be used to show the path through a maze or to link trivia questions with the correct answer. World Book Day was a great success - our performance of Jabberwocky went down a storm! The effort children had made for their costumes was fabulous! Well done Year 6!
