



Year 1

On Monday, the children enjoyed carrying out a range of different activities for Judaism day. They learnt about the synagogue where the Jewish people go to pray, as well as learning about Hanukkah and Shabbat. Class 1AP went on their visit to Werrington library and enjoyed taking part in a book hunt to learn more about the books there. In English this week we we have been focusing on formal and informal letters and the children have highlighted different features. Next week they will be writing their own letters to Beegu. In Maths we have been looking at weight and the children have been learning how to identify the heaviest, lightest or objects that weigh the same using the balance scales. In Geography we have been learning all about the Arctic and Antarctic and the children have compared the polar regions to the UK. In Science, the children have planted a range of seeds and bulbs and will watch how they grow throughout the term.

Year 3


It has been another busy learning week in Year 3 this week. We began a new Maths unit all about money. So far we have been learning to count up amounts and convert pounds to pence.


In English we have continued our Myths and Legends unit with the story of Romulus and Remus. We have role played the story and began to create our own version using speech to build up the narrative.

Year 6

This week we have been focussing on lots of different areas of maths including: 2D and 3D shape; area, perimeter and volume; ordering and comparing fractions; reading scales and solving multi-step problems using the 4 operations.

In our reading comprehension lessons, we have been practising answering tricky three mark questions and have perfected using the phrase 'In the text it says....' Please continue to support your child's reading at home when you can as it makes such a difference to their confidence when reading a text.

In Science, the children have been investigating the different chemical reactions that happen when different substances are mixed - they have done this by using various substances to clean old coins!
