

Our Nursery Rhyme this week has been 5 Little Ducks. We have also been thinking about families, talking about our own, looking at photo's and drawing pictures of our families.

In Maths we have been looking at patterns and describing what we can see - we have even designed some new patterned tops for Mrs Simmons. We have also introduced subitising which means knowing how many dots there are without counting them. We have been using a special phrase 'fast eyes to subitise!'

In phonics we have learnt 4 new sounds: i and n and tricky words I and is. We have also been having a go at writing some of our letters.

As part of International languages day we also learnt some spanish words. We can say hello and goodbye and count to 5. We also had a go at Flamenco dancing.

We had a wonderful visit from the "Kapla" construction company this week. The children enjoyed working as a team to make some wonderful snake and caterpillar models.



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


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Year 2

In English, we have started to look at how instructions are written with a focus on imperative verbs and will continue to write instructions next week. In maths we have been using number lines to order 2 digit numbers and we have been partitioning numbers into tens and ones. The children have been showing the 4 Rs (resilience, relationships, reflectiveness and resourcefulness) across all subjects this week, fantastic work Year 2!





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Year 3

Year 3 started the week by conducting their own science experiment. The children looked at the permeability of rocks. In order to do this, the children put drops of water on different rocks and observed whether the water soaked through.

On Thursday, the children enjoyed their team building day. As part of this, the children took part in a range of challenging activities that required communication, collaboration and resilience. It was brilliant to see the children working so well together. Well done year 3! After this, they enjoyed watching a film and eating some lovely food. A wonderful day was had by all.





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Year 4

What a jam packed week year 4 have had this week, we have written a diary entry from the perspective of Michael the main character in our class text and continued to work on our place value. During our science lesson we have investigated classifying vertebrate in more detail and enjoyed looking at physical and human geography. The children all had an amazing Kapla obsession on Tuesday and worked hard to complete a bridge and build train carriages on top of it. In addition during 'International Languages Day' we took a closer look at Spanish and not only the language but the culture. Well done year 4!





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Year 5

We had an amazing experience with our Kapla workshop on Tuesday - what amazing structures we created. We developed construction skills and team work skills. We also made sundials this week to see how the shadows can help tell the time as the earth rotates on its axis. Our maths skills working with negative numbers have developed in maths and we have continued with our Cosmic work in English. 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Year 6

This week in Year 6 we have thoroughly enjoyed our time building giraffes and viking boats as part of our KAPLA afternoon.
