Year 1

This week in Year 1, the children have enjoyed making their own jam or marmalade sandwiches. They have then written their own instructions to tell other people how to make a sandwich, using a range of time connectives and verbs. In Maths, the children have continued to subtract numbers up to 20 and have used the <> and = symbols to compare number sentences. In Science, the children explored a range of materials including wood, metal and plastic and then used a range of adjectives to describe them.

Year 2

In Year 2 this week, during English, we have begun to read the stories of Mwenye Hadithi as part of our Africa topic and will continue our work on these next week. In maths, we have been learning about fractions. We have been learning about quarters, halves and thirds. We have also learned the difference between unit and non-unit fractions and equivalent fractions. In art, we made our own printing plates to create African animal patterns. In Science, we enjoyed a walk around the school grounds to look for signs of plant growth.

Year 3

It has been a creative week of learning in Year 3.

In art, the children have continued their learning about paper sculptures. Last week, they were given the challenge of making a piece of art using just paper and glue. This week, they used the same resources but tried to make their paper sculpture larger and more intricate. The children were very resilient as they found that working paper can be very tricky. However, the children created some fantastic paper sculptures.

In maths, the children have been learning all about length. As part of this, the children measured their standing broad jumps in metres and centimetres. It was great to see the children jumping further and beating their personal best distances whilst accurately measuring their jumps. Well done Year 3!











Year 4

In Science, Year 4 have been learning all about their teeth. They can now name the different teeth inside their mouths and describe their different functions.

Last week, they set up an experiment to find out the effect different liquids have on teeth. They recognised how their test needed to be fair and the children worked with precision when measuring liquids and placing the eggs (used for teeth) inside the cups.

This week, the children observed the effects that milk, water, cola, sugar-free cola, orange juice and vinegar had on the eggs. They recorded how the eggs felt and what they looked like. This enabled them to make a judgement about the effect the liquid had.

Using the photograph below, do speak with your child about what they observed.

We are looking forward to discussing why the changes happened and making our conclusions about which liquid is the healthiest for the best oral health.


Year 5
